

ISSAQUAH HIGHLANDS COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION

Our Dedicated Homeowners Association

PURPOSE

The Issaquah Highlands Community
Association (IHCA) manages the community's
fiscal and environmental assets. Its mission is to
maintain the value of Issaquah Highlands
properties and the quality of life for the
residential community.

ROLE

- Enforcement of the community standards
- Landscape and maintenance of common areas, including parks
- Architect and builder relations
- Home and commercial building modification review
- Collaboration with the city of Issaquah and commercial landowners

STRUCTURE

A volunteer board of directors governs IHCA affairs, each member with one equal vote. The board is comprised of Issaquah Highlands homeowners with representation from each board district. Homeowners elect the board, which hires the IHCA executive director.

FEES

Assessments are fees each homeowner pays to fund their share of common expenses benefitting all, or a portion of, the association. Base assessments are levied equally against all homes, based on an annual budget prepared by the board, covering the estimated costs of operating the association. Supplemental neighborhood assessments are fees paid by a homeowner to fund additional services for their specific neighborhood above the base assessment.

HIGHLANDS FIBER NETWORK

Community-Owned Fiber to the Home

PURPOSE

Highlands Fiber Network (HFN) is a state-of-the-art fiber network providing data, voice, and other advanced communications services to the community.

BENEFITS

- Fast, reliable, secure fiber internet connectivity
- Gigabit speeds available
- Symmetrical download and upload speeds
- No bandwidth caps, no throttling
- Low-cost telephone service

STRUCTURE

HFN is governed by a volunteer board of directors, made up of homeowners, GigabitNow representatives, and the HFN general manager. The directors set policy and hire the general manager.

FEES

HFN payments are not part of your homeowner's association dues or other community payments. There is a \$250 connection fee required at closing and a minimum required monthly periodic fee is billed monthly after closing. Plan upgrades and other services are available at an additional cost.

Issaquah Highlands homes and buildings that are part of the Covenant for Community are required to take a minimum level of HFN service. Non-covenant homes can subscribe to HFN services; however, they must join the Covenant for Community to receive gigabit service.
