Temporary units must be removed by October 15in extreme hot weather months on a temporary basis only. The following restrictions apply: Renters, rental units, apartment complexes and condominiums are required to seek approval from owners or management companies prior to installing temporary window air conditioning units. Window-mounted AC units and necessary support brackets must be installed in accordance with manufacture instructions. in a professional manner.
